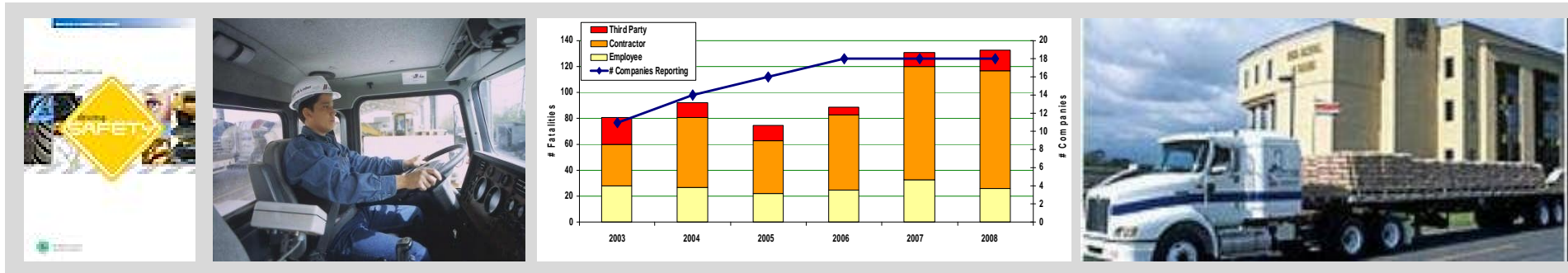

- Monthly TF conference calls: good participation from TF



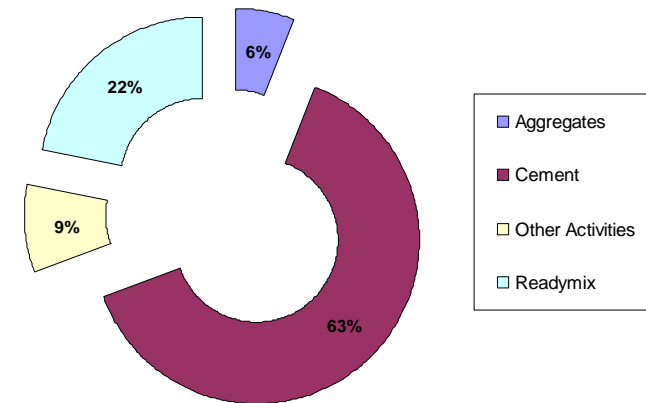
Driver and Contractor Initiative

Trend in fatality numbers

- Less fatalities, but still unacceptable high numbers
- The highest number is in Cement, which continues as the predominant activity of the 18 CSI Members
- **6 companies reported zero fatalities in 2009** for all the activity categories they reported

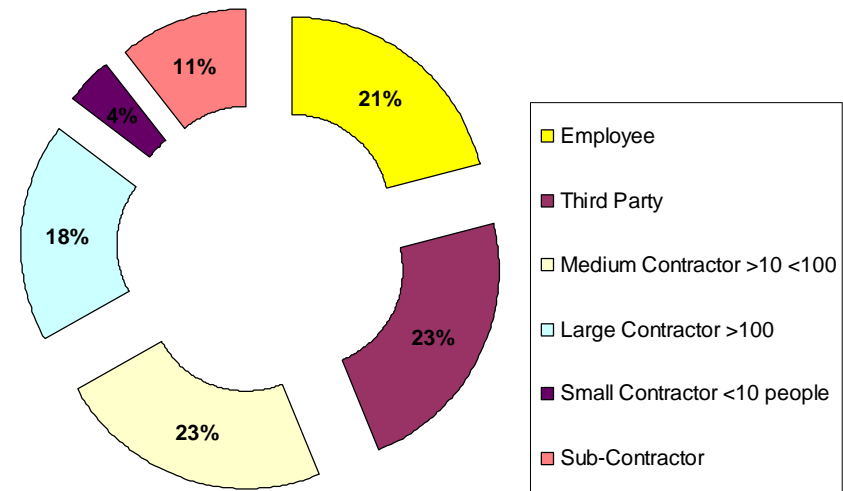

Trend by Category

- Contractor fatalities are still the largest category
- Medium (>10 FTE) to large contractor companies are mostly affected
- The predominance of Contractor fatalities has led to the TF3 Contractor Safety initiative

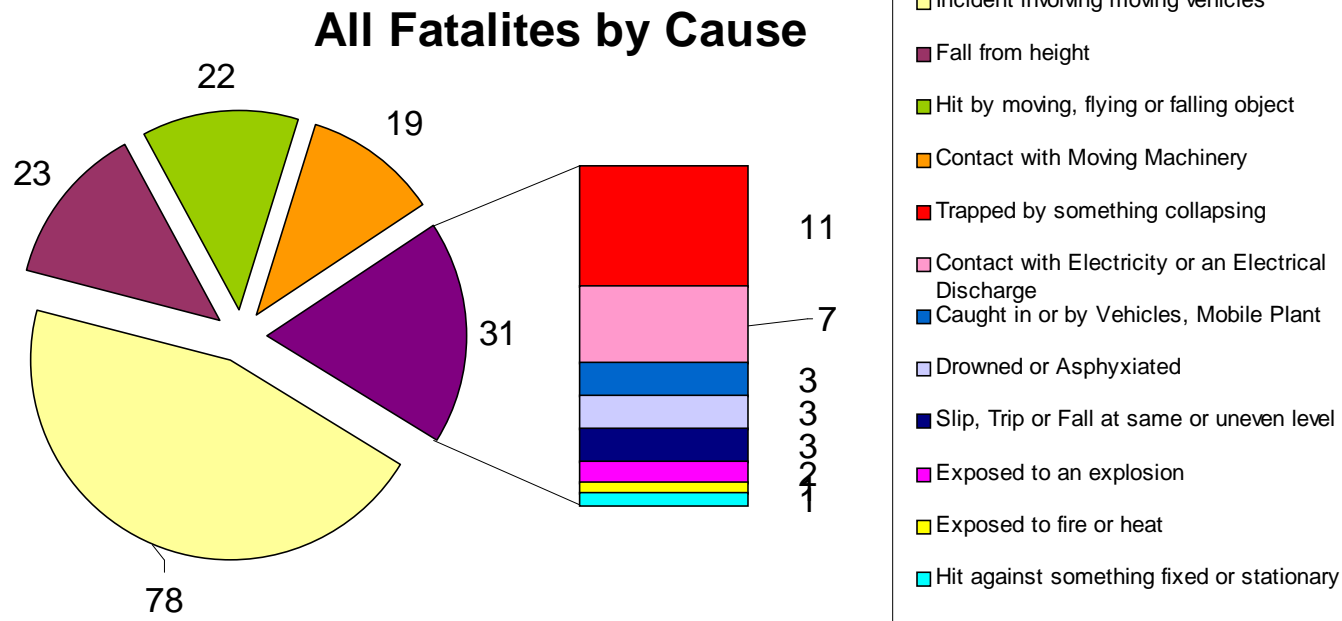

2009 Fatalities by Direct Cause

- The Direct Causes of all 2009 Fatalities were similar to prior years: incidents with moving vehicles (45%), falls from height and hit by objects (both 13%) and caught in moving machinery (11%), totalling 82% between these 4 main causes
